DYLAN CAVIN'S CREATIVITY EXPANDS HIS MARKET

A big thank you to everyone who has visited to see the featured artist exhibit, Woodland Hymn: Sketches & Paintings by Christen Walden. Also, a thank you to everyone who has purchased her pieces. Her show remains up through Oct. 31. Then it will be a whirlwind task to bring it down and install the holiday show featuring the art of Dylan Cavin that opens Nov. 3.

The Heritage Center's Exhibit, The Art of Dylan Cavin, Nov. 3, 2015 - Jan. 6, 2016, will feature 24-26 pieces, ranging from 9 x 12 to 24 x 36 inches. There will be paintings and sketches featuring bison, grackles and Oklahoma history. Much of it is on antique ledger documents he's collected.

For those who attended and enjoyed Mikel Davison's show a year ago, we are sure you will enjoy this show.



Dylan's work was cover art of the July/August 2012 Oklahoma Today magazine. Since then, Dylan's art has gained popularity across the country. Multiple shows keep him busy and in addition to creating work for his exhibit at the Heritage Center, he's also prepping for the Smithsonian's National Museum of The American Indians Holiday Art Market in December. We asked Dylan about his success at shows and what is

the biggest reward he gains from attending them and selling his art. Here's a portion of his response: "I feel like that is one of the biggest compliments you can give an artist is to buy their art and hang it in your home ... ribbons never hurt either."

He placed first at Cahokia in 2d, has earned honorable mention at Indian Market for a drawing, and a first at SEASAM in graphics, among others. On top of the shows and creating art to keep his inventory ample, he works full time as a graphic design artist.



Also, STEAM principles taught will be: S, the science of scorpions, spiders, ticks; T - the technology of railroads; E, the engineering of barbed wire; A, the art and history of ledger art; and M, the math of the cattle business, using a math game.

Children and adults can touch the items, which are also identified for learning purposes. In our Abernathy Boys education session, students learn about wolves and can touch the pelt in our collection. The Abernathy session ends Oct. 30.

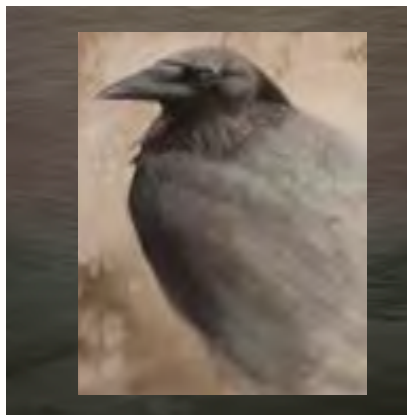
