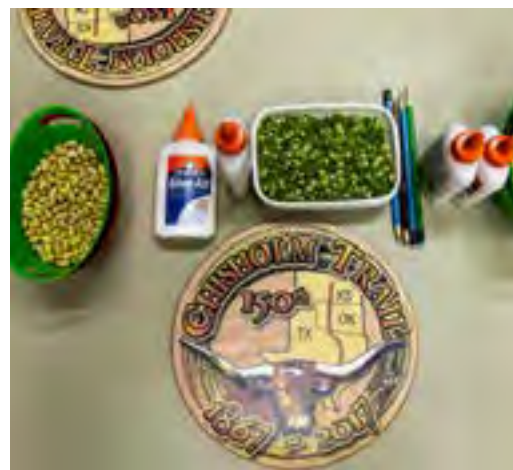

Stella Dutton didn't have to look far for inspiration when it came to writing "Pinto the Chisholm Pony."

"I always heard stories about the Chisholm Trail from my grandparents. My grandmother had actually met some of the old former cattle drivers when she was a child in 1910 rural Oklahoma. I wanted to create a story that would show children how the Chisholm Trail once was before it was covered in concrete," she said. (Lone Star Literary Life interview)

Even though it is a children's story book, it also provides educational value, with each town on the Chisholm Trail listed and an illustrated map. This is a commemorative book and it has been recognized by Chisholm150.org as an official part of the 150th celebration. The front cover proudly displays the Chisholm150 logo.
