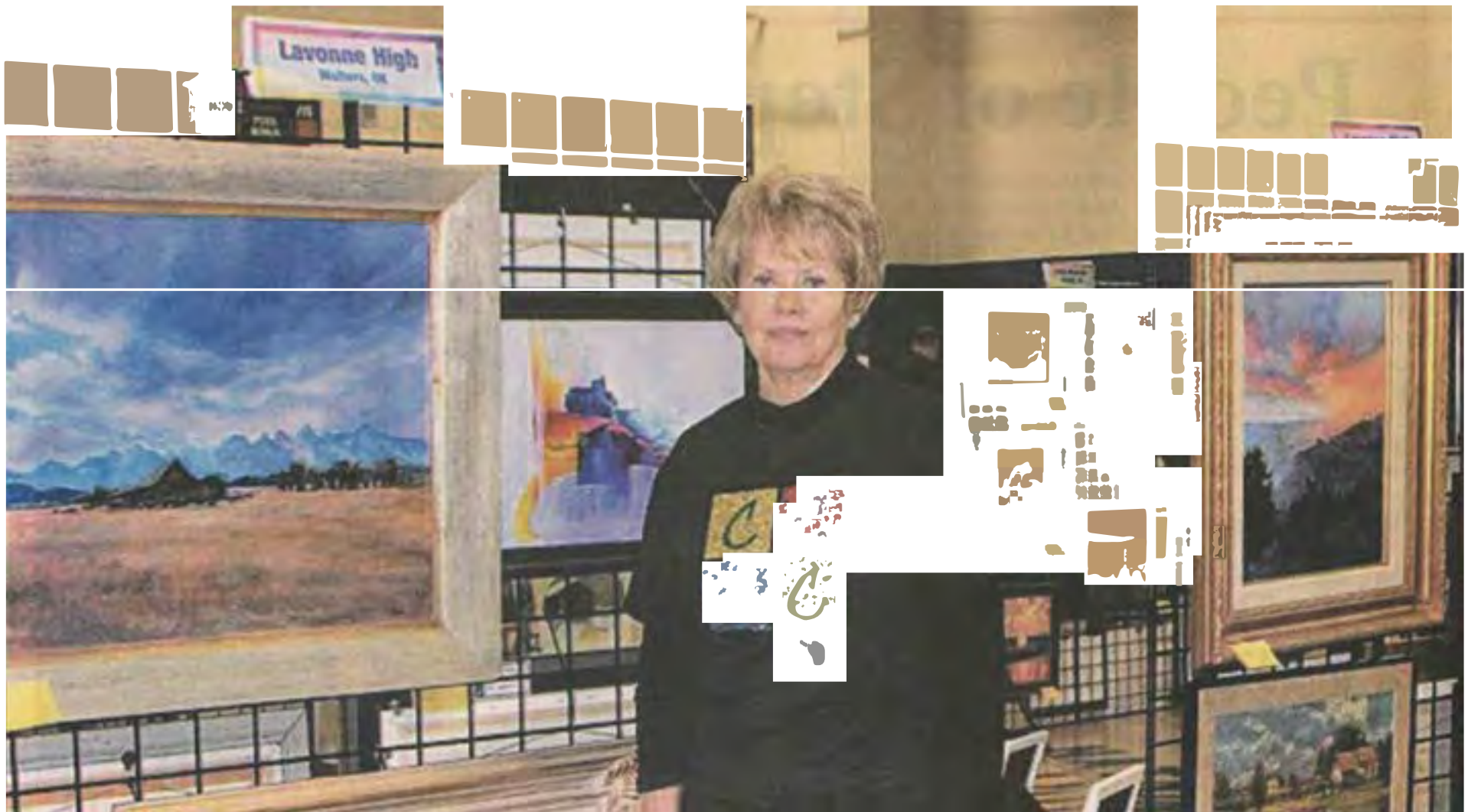


CTHC to feature Cotton County Art Council in holiday exhibition
