Elementary school students have been learning their Oklahoma history with our Oklahoma History Heroes program. This year, Miss Edie Stewart is performing the role of Pearl Carter Scott as she shares Pearl's story. Pearl was the youngest pilot in the United States to solo an aircraft, on Sept. 12, 1928, when she was only 12-years-old. In the educational, interactive field trip program, students learn about aeronautics, Oklahoma inventions and inventors, participate in a tape measure home run math lesson (Mickey Mantle!) and create an art project.
