years, give or take a few thousand hours, to create this at the request of Thomas McCasland Jr., who was friends with Paul's father, Bill Moore. This work of art was cast in the Shidony Foundry, near Santa Fe, New Mexico. And the guys pictured cleaning it? They were involved in this project at The Shidony.

A cowboy poetry contest that will be held at the Duncan Public Library community building from noon to 2 p.m. More details will be posted on our website and in future newsletters.

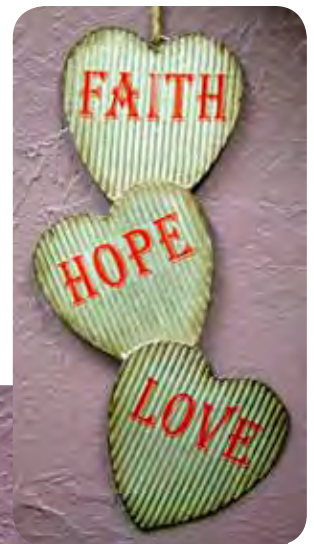
