




Our Mission: "To celebrate and perpetuate the history, art and culture of the Chisholm Trail, the American Cowboy and the American West."

Allan Houser's legend becomes main focus of museum for summer

We are one of nine Oklahoma museums participating in Celebrating Allan Houser – An Oklahoma Perspective project. Our exhibition is titled Allan Houser: Legend Born Free and our staff is excited to create a cohesive and interesting show that ties in with the focus of our continued cowboy culture and arts series during the summer education session.

Our main exhibit room will be closed for the last two weeks of this month as it undergoes a transformation as the staff begins the final work for the show. Allan Houser, who would have been 100 years old this year, was the first Chiricahua Apache born into freedom in 1914. His work includes illustrations, bronzes and paintings. One of his bronzes, Desert Flower, is in our permanent collection in the Garis Gallery of the American West. The exhibition will include

original illustrations and the bronze. Additionally, our administrative staff has acquired all seven of the children's books in which Houser's illustrations appeared. These and historical Apache reproduction photos will be featured in our main lobby. Educational Coordinator Leah Mulkey's lesson plans for the education department include art projects based on Houser's illustrations from the book, Blue Canyon Horse. The DVD "Unconquered: Allan Houser and the legacy of one Apache Family" narrated by Val Kilmer, is already available in our gift shop. The documentary is approved by the Houser Legacy and follows the Houser/Haozous story. Our educational instructors are also studying the history of Houser and the Apache nation for the summer program.



Celebrating Oklahoma, writers and creativity

Oklahoma Poems and Their Poets, edited by Nathan Brown, is the newest treasure in our gift shop.

Dr. Nathan Brown is Oklahoma's Poet Laureate, but we take delight in having claimed him first, as he has been teaching area sixth-grade students for four years through our "Writing in Response to Art" creative writing program. The program was established by Education Coordinator Leah Mulkey as an outreach effort to Duncan Middle School students. It was so successful in that first year, it was offered to students from Empire and Marlow. A reception is held in the spring and students can read their writing. Nearly 40 students and parents attended this year's reception May 4.



After the event, Nathan told us about the book. The book was created for the Oklahoma Humanities Council and is an anthology of poems about Oklahoma.

They are not all written by Oklahomans, but by a diverse group of people from across the country. Everyone who submitted a poem has a connection or

bond with Oklahoma.

"We have Pulitzer Prize winners and some big names in this book. All the artists, including the visual artists who did the cover, have their bios in the back of the book. Rick Sinnett is the cover artist. He paints these dramatic murals of Route 66."

All work was donated to support the OHC and profits from the book sales will also go to OHC. "My idea was to create a legacy project as state laureate," he shares. "I'm proud of each poem in there." July 7-11 VIDEO CAMP instructor Geoffrey Smith. This camp is now in its third year at CTHC and offers two sessions - morning and afternoon.

Morning session, 9 a.m. to noon, is for ages 11-13 years. Afternoon session is 1-4 p.m. for teens 14 to adult. Students learn how to shoot, edit and complete a video during these five days. Since 2002, Smith has been offering these camps at museums throughout Oklahoma.

July 14-18 CROCHET with Neva Kitsmiller, is 2-4 p.m. daily and available for all ages and skill level.

Class participants will get to create and complete an animation project in a flip book. When Daniel was 12 years old, he started creating animated shorts, using action figures and homemade backdrops. He has a degree in media production from Oklahoma Baptist University and he works at the Mabee-Gerrer Museum of Art designing exhibits.

"The great thing about flipbooks is that it takes you right to the heart of animation. You're learning the same techniques that film pioneers like Thomas Edison discovered. It's science, creativity and entertainment, all in a single exercise."
